



In Week 1 of this term, we looked at life events and what events happen during our lives that are important. When asked, lots of the children talked about the first time they met one of their friends. We said that these moments were important, but it was also the things you did together that created unforgettable moments.

Some of the children talked about holidays they had been on and visiting places such as the beach or going swimming. This led on to significant moments for the children, such as learning to ride a bike or scoring their first goal.



**Why are pirates and other criminals such popular characters in stories?**

We agreed that although villains are meant to be evil, nasty and terrifying, sometimes villains are likeable character. We agreed that lots of people like them because they can be:

- Funny
- Different
- Have cool outfits
- When they are being rude, they make us laugh.
- They want to change the world.
- They have exciting weapons.

We discussed what a character arc is. We talked about some villains go on a journey, realising they have made mistakes and become better people.

The children talked about the songs that they liked. When we looked at the question in detail, the children agreed that although you might not be able to understand it, you could still enjoy the music, the rhythm and the sound. Some went further and said it could help you learn words in another language and if the chorus was catchy that you could sing along with it.

The children talked extensively about the people they thought were good people, often referencing parents or friends. We talked about the qualities needed to be a good person. The children thought that being liked made you a good person, because that meant there was a lot of things people liked about you. We then talked about the qualities that make a good person.

The top 5 qualities the children came up with were kind, thoughtful, helpful, considerate and supportive.
