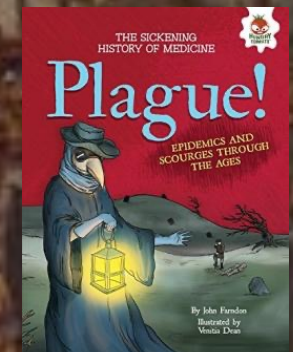
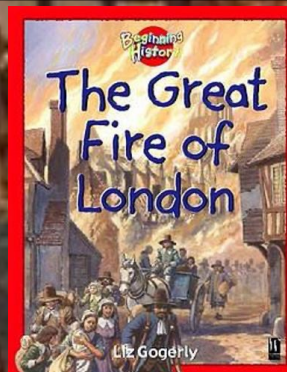
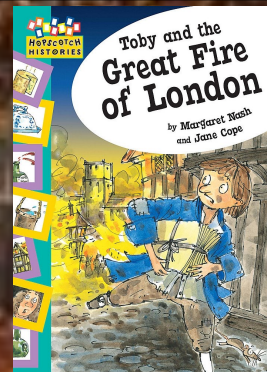
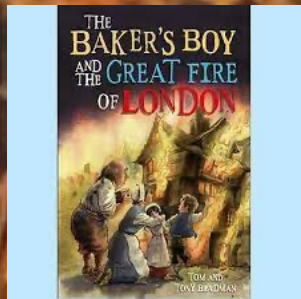
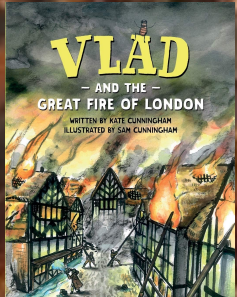
Through this term, we will be learning all about life changing events and people beyond living memory, primarily focusing on the Great Fire of London.

Vocabulary	Definition
History	The study of past events.
Similar	Explaining how things are the same or close to being the same.
Different	Explaining how things have changed, how they are different.
Chronology	The time order in which events happen.
Mistake	Something that is an accident, it was not done on purpose.
Purpose	Something that is done deliberately.
Significant	An important event or person, who has had an impact on society.
Source	This can be pictures, writing, objects that tell us something about the past.
Beyond living memory	Events before 1900 are seen as events beyond living memory, events people can't remember.
National	Relates to events within the country.
Global	Relates to world events.
